

Question for the Premier

Background

Transportation in rural Manitoba is challenging if you don't drive. Since 1989, the Mobility Disadvantaged Program (MDTP) has provided "Handitransit" services for eligible mobility disadvantaged persons. As the population ages, demand continues to grow. In FY 2013/14, MDTP funded Handi-van programs served 157 rural and northern municipalities. From 2009 to 2013 (five years), rural Handi-vans travelled 8,046,993 kms. while taking 803,576 trips; assisting eligible riders to: work, pursue their education, participate in adult day care and recreational activities, attend medical appointments and pursue daily living activities such as banking, shopping, etc.

Rural Handi- van operational costs have steadily increased but the contribution formula has not increased since the program's inception 26 years ago. The province covers 37.5 % to a maximum of \$20.0 for programs with one vehicle and \$30.0 for more than one vehicle. There is also a regional incentive grant of up to \$15.0. MDTP guidelines specify that the community is responsible for raising the remaining 62.5% of the gross operating expenses. I was very pleased to read about increased funding to Winnipeg Transit to "help keep fares low" but for just a moment imagine Winnipeg Handi-transit having to hold an annual bake sale, or ticket raffle to contribute to the community share.

The requirement for ongoing community fundraising in municipalities with a declining economic base (due to lost industry) may not be sustainable. However these communities often have a significant population of older adults that wish to age in place.

MDTP guidelines also recommend that 25% of program costs be covered by user fees. The increasing cost differential is also being borne by riders, the majority of which are on a fixed income. A senior in Swan River can expect to pay \$600.00 for round trip transportation to a medical appointment in Winnipeg.

There is currently no federal, or provincial funding for replacement vehicles.

Ontario recently announced a Community Transportation Grant Program for communities without a transportation system. It is not just seniors who are isolated due to a lack of affordable transportation options.

Is your party prepared to:

- Review the existing funding formula and legislation that supports the MDTP?
- Provide additional funding for the MDTP program?
- Work with rural communities to create a Community transportation option?
